In the month of March, we not only appreciate the warmer days and greener scenery that the promise of Spring brings, but we also

celebrate Women's History Month.

quick search provided some interesting facts about Women's History Month. The first Women's celebrated History Day was February 28, 1909, in New York City, which commemorated a strike for 15,000 female garment factory workers. On March 8, 1978, Women's History Day became Women's History Week after an education task force in California decided that more attention needed to be provided in elementary schools and President Carter declared the week of March 8th as Women's History Week in 1980. The Women's History Alliance lobbied Congress for acknowledgment of Women's History Month and in March 1987, their efforts were successful. Each President, since 1995, has issued a proclamation regarding the importance of Women's History Month.

As a history nerd, I will happily share an additional interesting tidbit that Wyoming was the first territory on December 10, 1869, to give women the right to vote and hold public office and Wyoming also elected the first Woman Governor, Nellie Tayloe Ross, in 1924. Additionally, Ms. Ross was
